When participating in our Youth Lodging Packages please contact the lodging establishment of choice for overnight reservations prior to making your reservation with Caberfae Peaks. Two separate reservations and two forms of payment are required. \$75 per person to Caberfae Peaks and \$75 per person to your lodging venue of choice.

A minimum of 15 people are required.

Each camp's lodging package includes a 2 night stay, 2 breakfasts and 1 dinner. Dinner will be packed and brought to Caberfae. Packaged dinners must be taken to our Skyview Lodge.

Caberfae Peaks requires a minimum of 15 participants and our package portion includes:

RESPONSIBILITIES AND CHECK IN FOR GROUP LEADERS

The Group Sales Office is located on the slope side of our main Ticket Office. (Sage green building)

All product transactions take place at the group sales office. Only one group leader should check the group in. Please have your group wait in a designated area as you check in. Do not send your group to our rental building. You will pick up all rental paperwork, tickets and meal vouchers for participants. For a speedier check in for you and other group leaders behind you, please have the following ready:

- The total number of participants.
- Any rental deletions or changes
- Confirmation of all registered lessons separated by ski or snowboard with names.
- Additional meal vouchers if needed at \$12 each (Submit tax-exempt form if eligible).
- Confirm all your participants have a digitally signed waiver prior to check-in.
- Have payment ready.
- Register your cell phone number (or a member in your group) in case of an emergency.

ANY CHANGES TO TICKET ORDERS MUST BE MADE BY THE GROUP LEADER NO LATER THAN 1 HOUR AFTER ARRIVAL. NO REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN AFTER THIS TIME.

Staging Your Group

Skyview Lodge: Picnic lunches permitted. This brick lodge is located just beyond our rental building. Equipped with seating, storage cubbies, countertops, and electrical outlets, we welcome all guests and groups bringing in their own food to stage themselves from this lodge. If dinner is to be packed and brought to Caberfae this is the lodge to use.

Blackmer Lodge: Cafeteria food only in this 2-story building. This is where you will redeem your meal vouchers. No outside picnic lunches, coolers, or outside food is permitted in this lodge.

LIABILITY AND RELEASE SIGNATURES

Once you make a group reservation you will be sent a waiver release link. Please forward this link to each participant in your group. Every participant must have a digitally signed liability waiver to receive a ticket and/or a rental. A parent or guardian signatures required for minors. No tickets or rental will be issued without a digitally signed waiver.

RENTAL EQUIPMENT

In order to qualify for the complimentary rental you must use our Express Rental Reservation form. Forms must be received **72-hours prior to arrival**. Rental submissions after this deadline will result in full retail rates. Forms are created using an Excel document that can be downloaded from any group page on our website, or shared through our Google Doc by email request only. **DO NOT** create your own!

All ski or snowboard equipment come with a helmet. Participants needing a helmet only must be on this form. Once your rental form is submitted any rental cancellations will be charged a \$5 cancellation fee. Rental submissions after the 72-hour deadline will result in full retail rental rates.

- For ski rental, review the Skier Type Chart to determine which category of skier matches your participant's style.
- For snowboard rental if no foot forward is assigned we will set as Left foot forward.
- Only one piece of equipment can be rented. No switching equipment is permitted without additional fees.
- We do not require participants to wear helmets but we do encourage them. They are complimentary with rental.

\$10 BEGINNER GROUP LESSONS

A 72 HOUR NOTICE IS REQUIRED

Our beginner group lessons are highly recommended for any participant **8 years of age or older** who has not learned the basics of turning or stopping. Encouraging and taking lessons from a trained professional can make all the difference and help beginners enjoy skiing or boarding during their visit. When submitting lesson requests we will need names of participant and type of equipment, 72 hours in advance.

- Beginner group lessons cost \$10 per person with advance reservations or \$15 after the deadline.
- Lesson times are scheduled by your group representative and last 55 minutes in length.
- Caberfae Peaks cannot guarantee instructor availability on our busier days. We highly suggest calling one or two weeks prior to arrival for morning lesson times.
- No refunds are given after 72 hours for cancellations, no shows or late arrivals. Payment is due at check-in.

MEAL VOUCHERS

LUNCH IS INCLUDED IN THE YOUTH LODGING PACKAGE

Our Tax Certificate of Exemption Form included in this packet is required and must be turned in upon arrival to avoid Michigan sales tax. Additional meal vouchers can be purchased for \$12 each.

VOUCHERS ARE REDEEMABLE ANYTIME THROUGHOUT THE LUNCH OR DINNER HOURS IN OUR BLACKMER LODGE.

CLASSIFY YOURSELF

Determining your skier type is your responsibility!

So what type of skier are you? There are three classes of skier types: Type I, Type II and Type III. Consult the descriptions below to select your classification. Your skier type, height, weight, gender, age and boot sole length are used by our ski shop technicians to determine the visual indicator settings of your ski bindings. Be sure to provide accurate and complete information as any error may increase your risk of injury or any uncompleted information will result in your equipment not being set.



SKIER TYPE I

- Ski conservatively
- Prefers slower speeds
- Prefers easy, moderate slopes

- Favors lower than average visual indicator settings. This corresponds to an increased risk of inadvertent binding release in order to increase the likelihood of release in a fall.
- Type I settings apply to entry level skiers uncertain of their classification.



SKIER TYPE II

- Ski moderately
- Prefers a variety of speeds
- Prefers varied terrain

- Type II skiers are skiers who do not meet all the descriptions of Type I or Type III skier types.



SKIER TYPE III

- Ski Aggressively
- Prefers fast speeds
- Prefers steeper & more challenging terrain

- Receive higher than average visual indicator settings. This may reduce the likelihood of release in a fall in order to decrease the risk of inadvertent binding release.

What does it mean, “Green” - “Blue” - “Black”?

Green circles are the color and symbol used for the beginner easiest trails to ski or board on. This is where all beginners ski or ride.

Blue squares are the color and symbol used for more difficult trails, or for intermediate skiers and riders.

Black diamonds and double diamonds are the trail color and symbol used for the most difficult and extremely difficult trails.
